

What Happens When You Report?

Terms:

DOS Representative

Staff members under the Dean of Student's office trained to support students who are experiencing significant challenges.

Title IX Coordinator

Responsible for ensuring compliance with Title IX regulations, including overseeing the handling of complaints and formal investigations.

Complainant

The student who initiates a report or is the person who experienced the report of discrimination, harassment, or sexual misconduct.

Respondent

The student accused of alleged misconduct.

Report Submitted

A student reports sexual misconduct. Report goes to the **Dean of Students Office (DOS)** and the **Office for Institutional Equity (OIE)**.

DOS Sends Initial Outreach

The student harmed receives an email with support resources and options

- You are **always** in control of how/when you respond.
- No time limit to reply or access resources.
- You do **not** need to file a formal complaint to receive resources.

If student responds...

The student can meet with a DOS staff member to explore

- Supportive Measures
- Response Options

Supportive Measures

Supportive measures are non-disciplinary help for safety/wellbeing such as:

- Academic flexibility
- Housing changes
- No-contact orders

Request for Additional Options

You can ask about additional paths, including:

- Adaptable Resolution
- Formal Investigation

Adaptable Resolution

A voluntary, informal process to reach mutual understanding or agreement between the complainant and respondent.

This would be handled by the DOS representative.

You can choose this at **any point** in the process.

Ex:

- Respondent education
- Agreements for..

Formal Investigation

If the complainant **chooses*** to move forward with a formal investigation, the Title IX Coordinator will reach out to the student with next steps.

A formal investigation is a structured process to investigate the report and determine responsibility.

*In very rare circumstances the Title IX Coordinator may need to move forward with a formal investigation without the complainant choosing. The complainant would not be mandated to be involved, and this circumstance would be discussed at length with the complainant prior to moving forward.



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Formal Investigation Process

Terms:

Hearing Officer

A neutral party that leads the hearing, reviews evidence, and makes the final decision.

Hearing Advisor

Someone who supports a student during the hearing process. They can help explain the process, provide guidance, and will ask questions on the student's behalf during the hearing.

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Submit Formal Complaint

Submit through the OIE website or via email (DOS staff can help!)

Intake Meeting with OIE Investigator

To help understand the process, share relevant information.

Notice of Investigation

Both parties (the complainant and respondent) get written notice with details of the allegations and the process.



Information Gathering

Investigator collects evidence: messages, names, interviews, etc.

Review & Feedback

Each party can review the evidence and submit feedback.

The investigator may revise or gather more information if needed

Feedback process then repeats.



Final Investigation Steps

- Investigator summarizes findings in a report
- Report shared for review by both parties
- The report is sent to a hearing officer
- Hearing Advisor is assigned (if needed).



Hearing Process

The hearing is a structured, live proceeding where the Hearing Officer considers the evidence and presents a determination. More information on this process is available in the "Formal Hearing Process" Flow Chart.



After the Hearing

- **If Respondent is found Responsible:** Sanctions & remedies set by OIE & DOS
- **If Found Not Responsible:** Supportive measures and other supportive resources continue.
- **Appeals are available for both parties.**



Remember

At any point in the process you are able to request an adaptable resolution, or request supportive measures only.

You are in control throughout the process.

Support is always available, no matter the path you choose.



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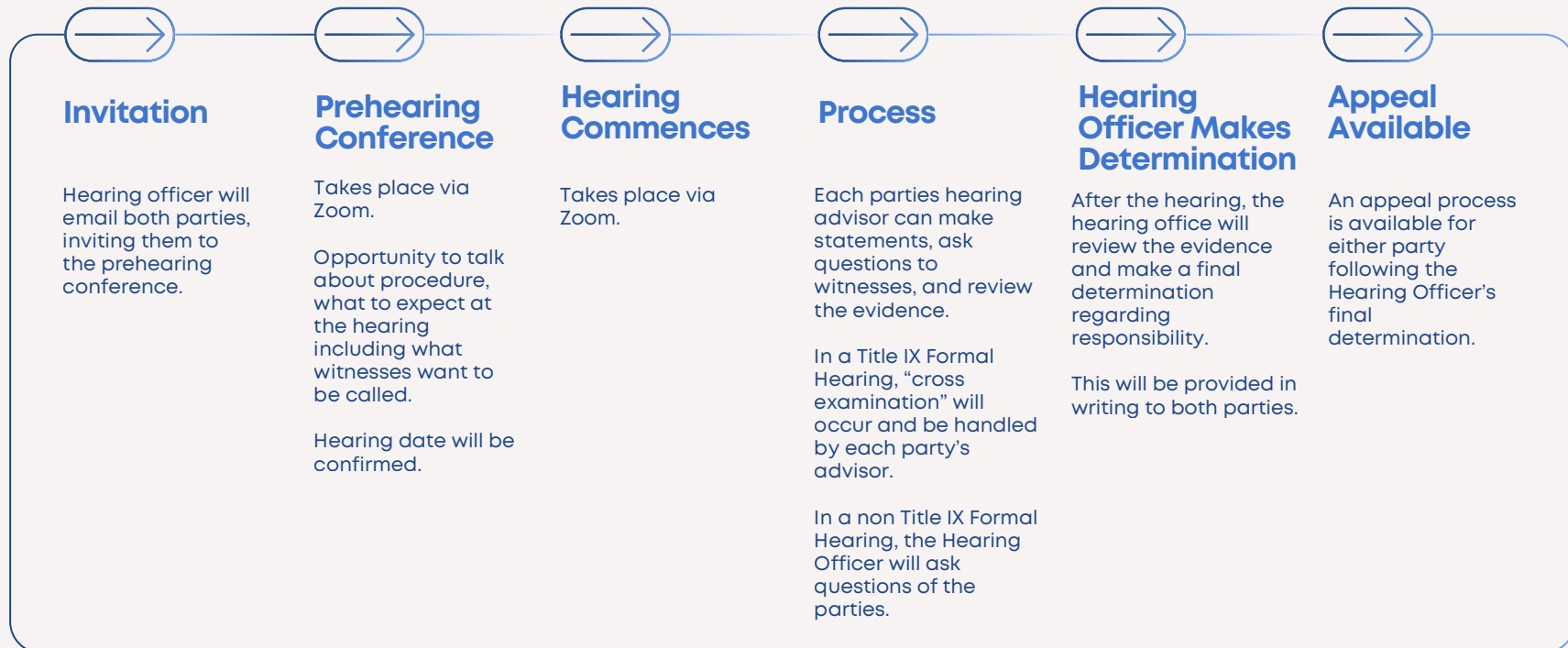
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
